Now I know how Eddie felt when he first went up to Canada. I have been stationed here in Florida for five days and this is the sixed [sic] day and so far no mail from either you or pop. I did receive two letters though one from Freida and one from Bunny, bus as for my own family -----

How are you, Cecil and Arthur. I intend waiting until tonight before writing to pop as I have to leave now. The only way I got to write this letter now was I got into my fatigues before the rest of the boys and I have about two minuts [sic] now.

I will write more as I get a chance.

Regards to all and kiss Arthur for me.
